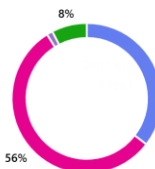

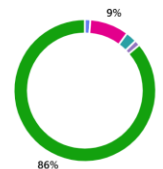

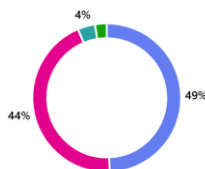

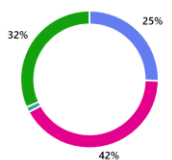

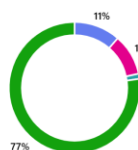

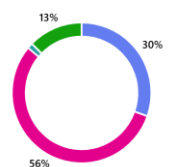

Manners Matter!

Every two weeks we have a behaviour focus with the children across the whole school which we call 'Focus of the Fortnight'.

At the moment we are focussed on manners. We would really appreciate your support to really embed these with your children. For example, children should be saying thank you if something is given to them and please if they are asking for something. They should be giving way to others in corridors and holding doors open and waiting their turn using the words excuse me and not interrupting others. Table manners are really important too - sitting down properly in a chair when eating, using cutlery properly, chewing with their mouth closed and using a calm quiet conversation voice. Hygiene manners are also a focus - cover mouth when they sneeze or cough, leave toilet areas neat and tidy, wash hands sensibly with the soap after using the toilet.

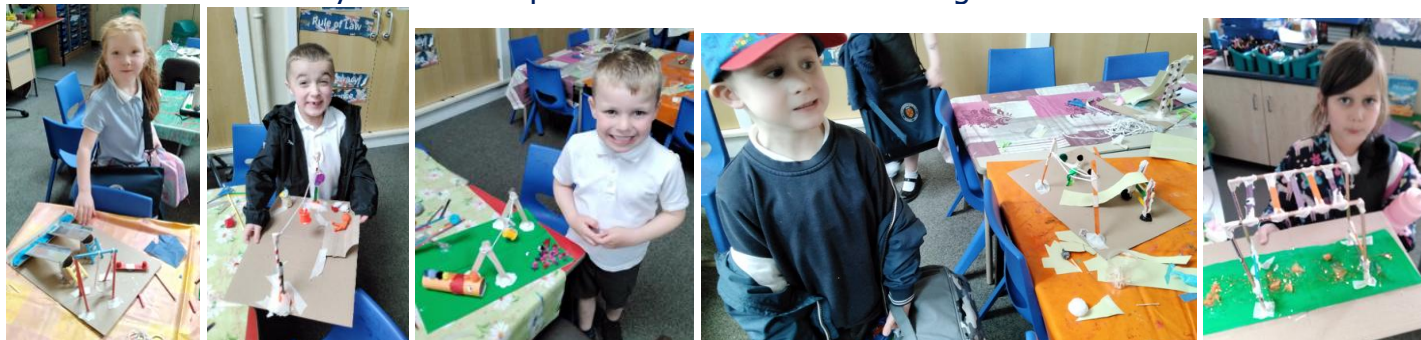
I'm sure you will agree that these are really important skills for children to learn and use in everyday life. Let's work together to achieve an improvement in manners across school.

It explains clearly for parents everything you need to know. Please can I remind parents that it is your responsibility to inform school if your child is going to be absent. Please ring the school office and leave a message. Punctuality is important too. A reminder that our school day starts at 8.55 a.m. Children should be seated in their classroom ready for the register at this time.

Thank you, parents/carers, for your co-operation in supporting high levels of school attendance and punctuality.

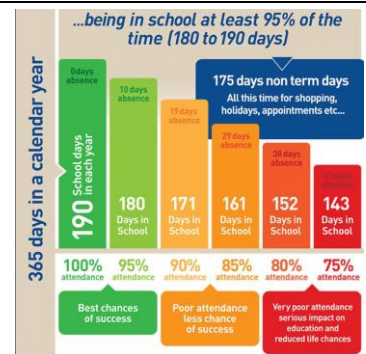
Attendance



"From the first day of term to the last, the small moments in a school day make a real difference to your child.

#AttendanceCounts"

Regular attendance is important to your child's success, children are expected to come to school every day. Attendance and achievement are closely linked and good habits, developed early in life do have an impact on levels of achievement. We regularly keep you informed about your child's attendance throughout the year and for the majority of our children attendance is good (96% or better).



Holidays during term time.

The school will not authorise an absence for a holiday during term time. Taking holidays during term time means that children miss important school time – both educationally and for other school activities. It will be difficult for children to catch up on work when they return to school. Only in exceptional circumstances may a holiday be authorised during term time – this will be decided by the Executive Head. Exceptional circumstances do not include cheaper costs, family availability or weather conditions. You can be fined if you take your child on holiday during term time.

Lateness

Good attendance doesn't just involve being present in school – it also involves punctuality. You also have a responsibility to ensure that your child arrives to school on time. **All children are expected to be in their classrooms at 8:55am every day for registration.** If they are not in their classrooms by 9:05am, they receive a late mark.

Can my child ever be absent?

When a child is absent from school, this will be classified as either 'authorised' or 'unauthorised'. The Executive Head decides which absences are granted as authorised. Authorised absences are only permitted for valid reasons, e.g.:

- Illness
- Medical or dental appointments which unavoidably fall during school time, for which the school has granted leave

- Family bereavement
- Religious or cultural observances for which the school has granted leave
- An absence due to a family emergency

Wherever possible, parents should always try to arrange medical and dental appointments during school holidays or after school hours.

What are unauthorised absences?

Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider essential or reasonable. Unauthorised absences can include:

- Forgetting school term dates
- Oversleeping
- Absences which have not been explained
- Arriving at school after the register has closed
- Keeping your child off school unnecessarily or without explanation
- Truancy before or during the school day
- Absence due to shopping, looking after other children or birthdays
- Absence due to day trips/family outings/holidays in term-time
- Leaving school for no reason during the day

School Absence Procedure:

Parents will be required to contact the school office via telephone (01159320005), in person or by email (info@scargill.derbyshire.sch.uk) before **8.55am** on the first day of their child's absence – they will be expected to provide an explanation for the absence and an estimation of how long the absence will last, e.g. one school day.

The school will always follow up any absences in order to:

- Ascertain the reason for the absence.
- Ensure the proper safeguarding action is being taken.
- Identify whether the absence is authorised or not.
- Identify the correct code to use to enter the data onto the school census system.

If no contact is made by 10.30am, a home visit may be carried out.

If a child has been absent for 3 days and has not been seen by a member of staff, the attendance officer/member of SLT may conduct an unannounced home visit.

What does the law say?

All children of compulsory school age – between 5-16 – must receive a suitable full-time education. As a parent, you are responsible for ensuring that this happens, either by registering your child at a school or by making appropriate alternative arrangements. Once you have registered your child at a school, you are also legally responsible for ensuring that your child attends school regularly. If you fail to do this, legal action can be taken against you by the LA. It is a legal offence to fail to ensure your child attends school regularly. Legal action can involve a penalty notice or being taken to court. Parents also face the risk of imprisonment and parenting orders. **The DFE is made changes to this for September 2024 and the fines will be as follows – an increase from £60 to £80 if paid within 21 days and from £120 to £160 if paid in 28 days. Please refer to the Derbyshire County Council letter that can be found on our website.**

How can parents help?

You can help in many ways:

- Encourage good attendance by making sure your child goes to school regularly.
- Take an interest in your child's school work.
- Make sure your child understands that you do not approve of absence from school.
- Inform us (via the school office) of your child's absence, and keep us updated throughout the absence period.
- Cooperate with our school to make sure your child overcomes any attendance problems. We are here to help if you are having difficulties, we can help so please tell us.
- Discuss planned absences with the Head of School and apply for permission well in advance (two weeks minimum notice). Email info@scargill.derbyshire.sch.uk
- Only take your child out of school during term time where the absence has been authorised.

If your child is aged 4-16 and eligible for benefits-related free school meals, they're entitled to funded places at It's About Me holiday clubs.*

Our clubs offer a wide variety of activities, including sports, arts and crafts, cooking, dance, music, and more —so there's something to suit everyone! Each session also includes a nutritious meal to keep children happy, healthy and energised throughout the day.

Every club runs its own unique programme depending on its location, meaning there's always something new to discover.

Not eligible? Many clubs also offer paid places, so every child can still get involved and enjoy the fun.
