The children have had a fantastic first week back at school, and it has been wonderful to see so many of them looking so smart in their uniforms and ready for learning.


To help us return any misplaced items quickly, please make sure that all clothing and belongings are clearly labeled with your child's name. This way, their clothes can always find their way back to the right child.

Reading

Reading is such an important life skill and helps all children to access learning at school. Daily reads are an essential element of your child's reading progression. As your child progresses into and through KS1 we would like to thank you in advance for your continued support with home reading because it really does make the greatest difference to children's ability and confidence.

Remember that reading for pleasure can be reading any book at home, a sign, recipe, comic strip or magazine as well as your child's school reading book.

Please log all reads in your child's new reading record, this can be in the form of a comment or simply just an initial to acknowledge a read has taken place.

Year 1 continue to follow the Little Wandle phonics programme and as such have group reading whilst in school. This is also the case for any Year 2 children who are securing their reading abilities. Each Wednesday these children will take their reading book home to share with you at home. By the time your child takes their book home they should be reading with 100% accuracy, so it should appear easy for them to read. Reading at this stage involves reading with prosody, developing comprehension and recognising more words on sight, rather than overly sounding and blending. We use the Little Wandle assessment to ensure children are on the right book level throughout the year, just as they did in Reception. Sometimes this may mean having the same book more than once- this is perfectly normal, as re-reading a book means that skills can be applied which may not have been so secure on the first read.

In addition to the phonic reading book children will also take home a library book which they can change as often as they like as we have reading areas in our classrooms. In addition Mrs Bull and Miss Dexter will be opening up our school library after school each Wednesday for a perfect time to pop in with your child.

We love to encourage and reward our children for reading, therefore in KS1 all children will be given a red bookmark which has a caterpillar on with 25 segments. Every time your child reads at home or hears someone else read at home they should colour one segment of the caterpillar and the adult needs to record the reading in the reading record (no need to write lots- this just helps to be sure that children are reading at home and colouring in the segments to match). When they have coloured all 25 segments they need to hand in their bookmark, where they will then be given a certificate and an orange bookmark. This process continues until they have completed all the coloured bookmarks.

Phonics and Spelling

Year 1 will continue to progress through the Little Wandle phonics scheme with a daily phonics lesson. Each Friday a sheet will be sent home to share the graphemes and digraphs we have been working on along with some spellings which have been the focus for the week. Please support your child with these, like we said previously your help really does make a difference in embedding their learning.

We understand that some Year 2 children may not have quite completed the phonics programme and therefore these children will be revisiting and developing their phonic knowledge.

The majority of Year 2 children will move onto the Little Wandle spelling programme to support their confidence and ability to apply key spelling rules.

To explain a little more about phonics, spelling and reading we would like to invite Y1 parents in for a briefing meeting—check out the important dates to find out when this will take place!

Homework

Children will have 2 types of homework; one week it will be paper based, and the following week it will be set online using Purple Mash and My Maths. This means your child has just under two weeks to complete each set of homework. The login details for these will be sent during the first couple of weeks of term 1.

It is worth purchasing a glue stick as paper-based homework will be sent with your child's homework book. Once your child has completed their homework, then this must be stuck into their book to ensure it can be returned safely to school. Homework books must be returned to school by the Wednesday in readiness for the next set of paper homework.
