Times Tables

It is not long until all of Year 4 complete the statutory Multiplication Tables Check, to assess their recall of their times tables which is essential to future success in Mathematics.

As well as weekly coverage and practise across the Key Stage within Maths sessions, we also encourage children to practice regularly at home through Times Table RockStars.

We would hate for lack on internet access to be a barrier to any pupils success, there are regular opportunities across the week for pupils to access TT RockStars at lunchtime under the supervision of their class teachers. Please get your child to ask their teacher if they would to practise more in school!



NUT ALLERGIES

We have children in school who could have an anaphylactic reaction if exposed to nuts or nut traces.
