

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Ofsted

As you are aware we had a 2-day inspection last week. We are hoping that the report will be available to parents before Christmas. We are unable to share the outcome until the report is released. We appreciate that the Open Morning was scheduled for last week but unfortunately, running the open morning at the same time as Ofsted would have been impossible! Thank you for your understanding and we look forward to seeing you all this week.



11 by 11 is our pledge to allow all our children to experience 11 cultural opportunities whilst at Scargill. We are dedicated in ensuring our children leave us with a wide variety of memorable experiences which encourage, build on and enhance lifelong skills. Our list has been created by our whole school community to ensure it is bespoke to our children's needs. We want our children to be challenged, inspired and experience our awesome world. This is achieved through a range of

Many of these experiences involve a cost and we want to continue to offer a wide range of opportunities to all our children. However, over the last school year there was a significant increase in the amount of the school's budget (rather than parental contribution) being used to enable the trips/residentials to go ahead. Last year we almost had to cancel the Y5/6 trip to the Black Country Museum and we were forced to cancel the Y3/4 trip to The Yorkshire Wildlife Park.

As part of our 11 by 11 approach, theatre visits were arranged this year for the children. We appreciate that this was an additional cost but hoped that by informing parents well in advance in July that more payments would have willingly been made. Following texts and the letter reminding parents of the payments for the theatre trips, more payments were made but there was still a short fall. Knowing how much the children want to go to the theatre, the Senior Leadership Team agreed that school would cover the remaining cost.

However, moving forward, the school is simply not in a position to fund the increasing cost of trips and residentials where parents cannot contribute. Wanting to prevent the need to consider cancelling future trips, we looked at all the experiences on offer and felt that the number of residentials was disproportional compared with other schools. (Most schools in our trust offer one residential at the end of Y6). Looking at which residential was least value for money, we decided that by no longer offering the Y2 Lea Green residential that parents could use the money saved here towards fund the range of trips/residentials throughout the rest of their child's time at school.

Thanks to the parents who have contacted school in a constructive way to offer thoughts about how fundraising could support these rising costs and the best way to do this would be by getting involved and supporting Friends of Scargill (PTA). There are currently only 2 parent members of our PTA and with a parent community of around 600, we hope that more might want to help.

These coffee mornings are usually an hour long and are an opportunity for parents to share experiences together, ask questions and discuss all things SEND related.
