I have been really impressed by the children in their music lessons, where they have focused on pitch, dynamics and tempo whilst creating superhero music using either instruments or their voices- see if your child can remember what 'accelerando' means.











Earlier in the term we also had a cricket taster session, which the children loved taking part in. Some budding sporting stars in Badgers! Everyone achieved a sportsmanship diddi-dot for their fantastic behaviour and attitude to taking part.

Not long now until the end of Year 1- it would be a massive achievement if every Badger reached the end of the rainbow and won a prize for their efforts with reading. Please remember, each time your child reads, or listens to an adult read they can colour a segment on their bookmark. Once the book mark is complete remind your child to hand it in and they will be rewarded with a certificate and the next bookmark.

Curriculum- What will the children be learning this term?

Lots more fun for the final term! Sports day, transition morning and much more-continue reading to find out more.

Maths: Numbers to 100, money and time. We will then revisit key areas of learning to help deepen and secure knowledge.





What can you do to support your child? Help them with completing their online homework and paper homework as there is often a Maths activity set each week.

English- Reciting/performing a poem/nursery rhyme of their own- which will be linked to their homework- more information about this to come! The Magic Porridge Pot by Alan MacDonald- writing a fictional tale with a magical item, focusing on using 'and' to join clauses.



Science- We have now completed the Year 1 Science curriculum, and therefore will be focusing on retrieval and enquiry – linked to previously taught units, including animal groups.

Phonics Continue to revisit all grapheme and phonemes taught so far, developing fluency with more words being read speedily. We will move on to trickier graphemes such as 'mb', 'kn', 'gn' 'ti' along with many more. Please do keep practising the phonics using the home learning sheets which are sent home each Friday. Your support really does make a difference. Words should not only be read, but spelt too in line with Year 1 expectations. For more parental information please visit;

Computing- Animated Stories adding sound and movement.



Art and Design Craft and design, focusing on 'woven wonders'.



Design and Technology Food technology. Dips and dippers. Children will explore a range of dips and dippers before designing and creating their own. They will consider the different food groups and learn more about food hygiene and using equipment.



PE- Outdoor- Athletics along with striking and field games- We will complete our gymnastics unit started last term.

Polite Reminder 1

Polite Reminder 2

Book bags should not have key rings attached to them- not only are the bags weighed down by having lots of keyrings on then, they also cause injury/upset if children are caught by one. One small light keyring is acceptable.



Supporting Reading and Writing





Well done to all the certificate winners for working hard on Nessy- it is great to see the children making progress with their phonics and spelling in particular. Don't forget children can access Nessy at home, it is recommended to play 15 minutes at least 4 times a week.

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check- reminder

Year 1 have a daily phonics lesson, and as we move through the summer term these lessons will include some 'alien words', for example 'ot', 'elt', 'blang'. This is to help prepare children for the national screening check in June.

The phonics screening check is designed to confirm whether children have learnt phonic decoding to an appropriate standard. It will identify children who need extra help to improve their decoding skills. The check consists of 20 real words and 20 pseudo-words (alien words) that pupils read aloud to me. I will work with each child, in a quiet room. The children are prepared for this as they have taken part in practise screening checks throughout the year.
