agnostic	Someone who isn't sure about the existence of God.
atheist	Someone who doesn't believe in the existence of God.
Ten Commandments	Rules that many Jewish and Christian people believe were given by God.
morals	Standards of behaviour; principles of right and wrong.
values	Principles or standards of behaviour; one's judgement of what is important in life
The Golden Rule	An important rule or guideline linked to an organised worldview.
influence	Have an effect on something.

Humanists generally try to live good lives without following a religion. Their moral values are based on reason, shared human values and respect for others. They believe people should work together to improve the quality of life for all.

Many religions and some non-religious groups have a 'Golden Rule' that helps guide their moral decisions. They focus on treating others well.

Most Humanists are atheists. They rely on science and do not believe there is evidence that a god exists or ever existed.
