Key Reminders 1—Labels

Please, label every item of clothing, including plimsols. Within the first half term both classes had jumpers, socks and cardigans left with no names in. The children cannot distinguish which item of clothing belongs to them and staff are unable to support returning items without names clearly marked.

Key Reminders 2—Birthdays

In KS1 all children receive a sticker and are sung to for their birthday!

We have noticed that some parents have started to send in items to be given to children in their class when it is their child's birthday, which is a kind thought, but this is not needed.

Sweets etc... are not permitted in school, therefore we politely ask that parents do not send items into school. If you want to give out items, the best time to do this is at your child's party. As you can understand, it takes a while for children to complete their learning tasks during the day, and at the end of the day they are busy sorting their belongings for home, unfortunately we do not have time to be giving out birthday items. It is also rather distracting if these items are given out by parents at the end of the school day when children are trying to be returned safely to their grown ups— safeguarding is paramount, especially at this key transition point.



We will use 'The Rhythm of Life' by Michael Rosen to inspire our animal poetry.






The story of 'Little Red Riding Hood' will help us to consider character descriptions.
