Attendance

"From the first day of term to the last, the small moments in a school day make a real difference to your child.

#AttendanceCounts"



Regular attendance is important to your child's success, children are expected to come to school every day. Attendance and achievement are closely linked and good habits, developed early in life do have an impact on levels of achievement. We regularly keep you informed about your child's attendance throughout the year and for the majority of our children attendance is good (96% or better).

Holidays during term time.

The school will not authorise an absence for a holiday during term time. Taking holidays during term time means that children miss important school time – both educationally and for other school activities. It will be difficult for children to catch up on work when they return to school. Only in exceptional circumstances may a holiday be authorised during term time – this will be decided by the Head of School. Exceptional circumstances do not include cheaper costs, family availability or weather conditions. You can be fined if you take your child on holiday during term time.

Lateness

Good attendance doesn't just involve being present in school – it also involves punctuality. You also have a responsibility to ensure that your child arrives to school on time. **All children are expected to be in their classrooms at 8:55am every day for registration.** If they are not in their classrooms by 9:05am, they receive a late mark.

Can my child ever be absent?

When a child is absent from school, this will be classified as either 'authorised' or 'unauthorised'. The Head of School decides which absences are granted as authorised. Authorised absences are only permitted for valid

reasons, e.g.:

- Illness
- Medical or dental appointments which unavoidably fall during school time, for which the school has granted leave
- Family bereavement
- Religious or cultural observances for which the school has granted leave
- An absence due to a family emergency

Wherever possible, parents should always try to arrange medical and dental appointments during school holidays or after school hours.

What are unauthorised absences?

Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider essential or reasonable. Unauthorised absences can include:

- Forgetting school term dates
- Oversleeping
- Absences which have not been explained
- Arriving at school after the register has closed
- Keeping your child off school unnecessarily or without explanation
- Truancy before or during the school day
- Absence due to shopping, looking after other children or birthdays
- Absence due to day trips/family outings/holidays in term-time
- Leaving school for no reason during the day

School Absence Procedure:

Parents will be required to contact the school office via telephone (01159320005), in person or by email (info@scargill.derbyshire.sch.uk) before **8.55am** on the first day of their child's absence – they will be expected to provide an explanation for the absence and an estimation of how long the absence will last, e.g. one school day.

The school will always follow up any absences in order to:

- Ascertain the reason for the absence.
- Ensure the proper safeguarding action is being taken.
- Identify whether the absence is authorised or not.
- Identify the correct code to use to enter the data onto the school census system.

If no contact is made by 10.30am, a home visit may be carried out.

If a child has been absent for 3 days and has not been seen by a member of staff, the attendance officer/member of SLT may conduct an unannounced home visit.

What does the law say?

All children of compulsory school age – between 5-16 – must receive a suitable full-time education. As a parent, you are responsible for ensuring that this happens, either by registering your child at a school or by making appropriate alternative arrangements. Once you have registered your child at a school, you are also legally responsible for ensuring that your child attends school regularly. If you fail to do this, legal action can be taken against you by the LA. It is a legal offence to fail to ensure your child attends school regularly. Legal action can involve a penalty notice or being taken to court. Parents also face the risk of imprisonment

and parenting orders. Parenting orders involve attending a counselling and guidance programme, usually a parenting class. A penalty notice of £60 may be issued as an alternative to prosecution, but this will rise to £120 if it is not paid within 21 days. Failure to pay a penalty notice will usually lead to prosecution.

The DFE is making changes to this for September 2024 and the fines will be as follows – an increase from £60 to £80 if paid within 21 days and from £120 to £160 if paid in 28 days. Please refer to the Derbyshire County Council letter that can be found below this newsletter on our website.



School attendance update September 2024

Attendance categories

- 95 to 100% - as expected
- 91 to 94% - at risk of persistent absence
- 80 to 90% - persistent absence
- 51 to 79% - at risk of severe absence
- Less than or equal to 50% - severe absence

Support first approach

Missing school means children fall behind. This not only impacts on their future achievement, but also adds additional stress and worry as the pupil attempts to catch up. This can affect their mental health and that of their family.

Schools will always try to offer support to remove barriers to attendance before considering any form of legal intervention however they can only do this with the support of parents. If you do not engage with this support the school may feel that they have no choice than to request the Local Authority consider taking legal action against you for failure to secure your child's regular attendance at school under section 444(t) of the Education Act 1996.

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the below changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines for unauthorised absence after 19th August 2024.

Education Penalty Notices are issued to the parents of statutory school age children and can be issued to each parent or carer who is deemed liable for the child's absence from school.

- **First Offence**
The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)**
The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)**
The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Can my child take a holiday in term time?

The simple answer is NO - pupils can only take leave of absence during term time if this is approved in advance by the school. Leave taken without permission may result in a penalty notice and/or prosecution.

How can parents help?

You can help in many ways:

- Encourage good attendance by making sure your child goes to school regularly.
- Take an interest in your child's school work.
- Make sure your child understands that you do not approve of absence from school.
- Inform us (via the school office) of your child's absence, and keep us updated throughout the absence period.
- Cooperate with our school to make sure your child overcomes any attendance problems. We are here to help – if you are having difficulties we can help so please tell us.
- Discuss planned absences with the Head of School and apply for permission well in advance (two weeks minimum notice).
- Only take your child out of school during term time where the absence has been authorised.

'Pupil premium' is additional funding for our school to ensure we can support all pupils to achieve their best.

It's not a personal budget for individual pupils, but we will aim to prioritise the academic support of eligible pupils with it.

WHO'S ELIGIBLE?
Your child may be eligible if you receive: income support, jobseeker's allowance, employment and support allowance, asylum seeker support, universal credit, child tax credit, working tax credit, or state pension.

HOW DO I APPLY?
Get in touch with your local council as soon as possible to see if you're eligible.

Remember: Our school can only receive pupil premium for your child if you claim it.

As a school, we offer funding for afterschool sports clubs run by AM sports for all of our children who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding.


