
Our work across schools and communities aims to unite these ideals, equipping children, teachers, key workers and parents with essential knowledge and skillsets, raising awareness and standards in online environment safety. Through collaborative learning, training, and discussions about the good and bad elements of digital technologies, we can not only help safeguard children of all ages, from preschoolers right through to higher education, but also empower them to make smarter and safer choices on their own.

On Monday 5<sup>th</sup> February, Traci Good from the i-vengers Team will be coming into school for the whole day. She will complete workshops with children, staff and governors and at 5pm all parents are invited to attend a workshop which is specifically designed for helping parents to navigate the everchanging online world so they have the skills to keep their child safe. With children having much more online freedom and many more children having their own mobile phone we know how important it is for parents to be up-to-date and skilled in how to help their child. As part of our curriculum, we teach children how to stay safe online but we are also aware of the need for parents to have that understanding and ability to help their child when they are at home. In the past when we have run this session, the parents who attended have found it incredibly helpful.
