| puja | A Hindu act of devotion or worship which can be carried out at home or in a mandir. |
| rakat | A set of movements used in Muslim prayer. |
| salah | The word used for prayer or worship in Islam. |
| spiritual | Connecting to the soul or non-physical part of being human like deep feelings and thoughts. |

Hindus, Christians and Muslims pray in many different ways, both using set words and their own thoughts, words and feelings.


For many Christians, prayer is all to do with a relationship with God. Christians pray for different purposes including asking, thanking, saying sorry and praising.
