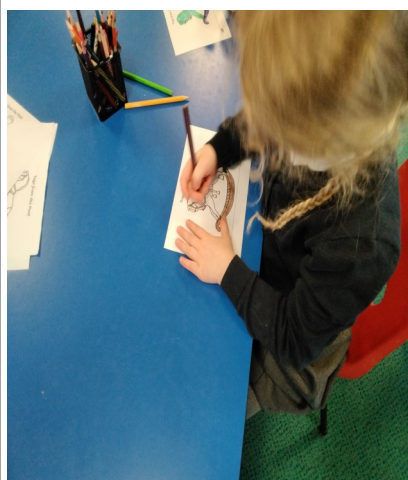
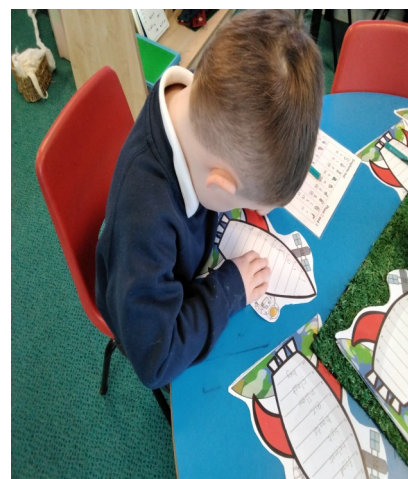




Reception Spring Term 1 2026 Newsletter
